Course description

This course offers participants a competence-based and holistic vision of entrepreneurship education and focus on the implementation of school activities to foster the development of related skills for students and teachers.

The course focuses on the concept of entrepreneurial education today and the related competences frameworks, on the development of learning environments supporting the development of these competences (new pedagogies, empathy, inclusiveness, multi-disciplinary approach) and on educational activities to foster some of these skills specifically (collaborative, peer to peer learning, problem solving etc.).

The activities are organised in short workshops, with hands-on approach, including parallel sessions, group and individual practice. The activities also support participants in developing their own educational resources and in sharing and collaborating with colleagues. The course includes a tour of the Future Classroom Lab and a presentation of its model and characteristics.

Learning objectives

- Learn about the concept of entrepreneurial education
- Understand the link between entrepreneurial education and the existing competences frameworks (such as EntreComp)
- Understand the connection between entrepreneurial education and innovative pedagogical approaches (project-based learning, active learning etc.) and positive learning environments (empathic, inclusive, supporting collaboration etc.)
- Learn what are the competences and skills that support the development of an entrepreneurial mind-set and how this can be fostered through educational activities
- Learn how to develop and embed such educational activities in day to day classroom and school practices

This course is open to participants from Belgium, France, Greece, Netherlands, Romania, and Spain. A maximum of five participants per country will be selected.


Requirements

- **Role:** primary and secondary teachers, ICT coordinators, school counsellors, school leaders
- **Language:** Intermediate knowledge of English (understanding, writing, reading and listening)
- **Time:** Availability in those exact dates
- **Experience and interest:** familiarity with the topic of entrepreneurship in education; experience and interest in implementing project-based learning and active learning approaches in schools; basic experience in designing learning resources.
- **ICT skills:** basic experience in using a range of digital tools for content creation (online forms, presentations, forums, editing images etc.).

Selection process

- **Open call** – 8-30 November 2018
- **Applications** – by 1 December
- **Selection and confirmation to participants** – by 20 December 2018

After being selected, in confirming the participation and registering in this course, participants will be requested to agree to the following Terms and Conditions.
