Aims:

- To present ALDA's work in Ukraine, including the U-LEAD with Europe project, and its role in promoting green reconstruction efforts to ALDA members and the broader public (open event)
- > To discuss the scale of landmines and unexploded ordnance issue in Ukraine
- > To raise awareness on the environmental impact of demining and ammunition destruction
- > To study the cases of the de-occupied Ukrainian cities (e.g., Bucha, Irpin) in demining
- > To learn Bosnia and Herzegovina's experience in post-war demining

Expected results:

- > Participants discover the scale of landmines issue in Ukraine.
- > The awareness of the environmental impact of demining and ammunition destruction is raised.
- > Participants learn case studies on how de-occupied communities in Ukraine dealt with demining.
- Participants get introduced to demining cases in de-occupied Ukrainian cities, such as Bucha an Irpin, leading to a better understanding of the challenges and effective strategies employed.
- Incorporation of Bosnia and Herzegovina's Demining Expertise: Integration of insights gained from Bosnia and Herzegovina's post-war demining experience, contributing to an enriched knowledge. base and potential improvements in demining practices.
