Confesal presents the BESPAT project in Spain with the holding of a workshop and a Conference in Madrid

Under the title "Personal and Household services: actions to promote quality and efficiency: Alliances in the market" last June 18 took place in Madrid, at the hotel Santo Domingo, the presentation in Spain of the European project BESPAT, included in the PROGRESS initiative, led by Confesal. On this occasion was held a workshop attended by the highest representatives of the main stakeholders of this project and aimed to identify and exchange good practices with regard to policies and actions in the field of Personal and Household Services (called PHS). This event was attended by companies in the sector such as Serdomas systems Sll from Madrid, Ayuda a Domicilio from Molina de Segura SAL or Principado Prevención SLL, , and other associative, political and social representatives from the scope of the PHS operating in Spain . After addressing the specifics aspects of this project, a Conference took place to present the broad outlines of this project to the stakeholders invited to this meeting. In a second part of the presentation of the project BESPAT were involved the main stakeholders in the PHS activities, in Spain. At this meeting were discussed aspects as identification of sectors with a future in the mentioned PHS , support for Personal and household services by the administrations, the Spanish law of dependence, good practices carried out and professionalization and development of this sector in the European Union.



SNS Fondazione exposes the BESPAT project before its stakeholders in Italy

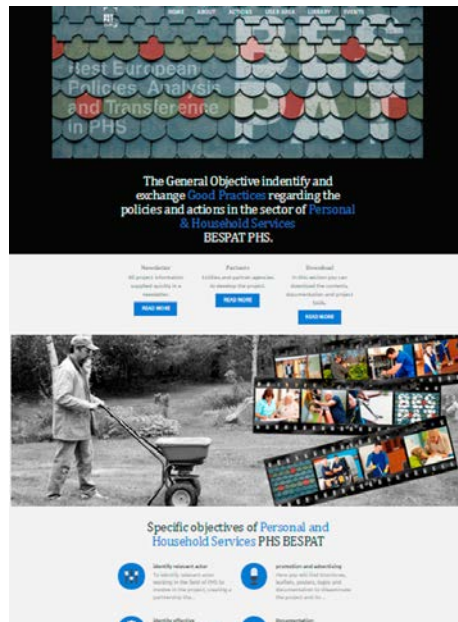

During the event, *the project was presented* to the stakeholders involved (among which various entities related to PHS) and SNS confirmed the need to develop a second presentation of the project in September. *In order to give the maximum* visibility to the project and to *disseminate its outcomes to maximum* effect, this second presentation will take place in another Italian city. *It is important to underline that* this project, led by the Confederación Empresarial de Sociedades Laborales of Spain (CONFESAL), aims at the identification and exchange of good practices in relation to policies and activities in the sector of Personal and household services (defined in the EU as PHS). This program, which belongs to the European initiative PROGRESS, takes into account, among others, the specific framework in legislation, social dialogue, coordination methods, the support system for innovation, new technologies and new organizations of work as a way of defining policies and actions which have to promote the quality and efficiency of these PHS.
