Objectives

This informative course will give you a preview of the new EU funding programs that have been approved for the years 2021-2027. You will have an overview of the main programs; learn how to search for useful information online; and work in a group to develop your own ideas.

Program

This is a great opportunity to benefit from the ALDA strategic partnership with the EU Commission and get to know exclusively in advance the new 2021-2027 funding programs. The course will allow you to understand what topics the EU will promote during the next few years and you will be given the right tools to develop new ideas in line with EU future.

Target group

The course addresses people who want to learn and/or improve their competences on the EU funding system and develop new skills to make the best use of the EU programs.

The course is therefore open to students, social workers, associations, cultural organisations, local authorities and interested individuals. No specific competence is required; it is necessary to speak English proficiently.

Methodology

The course will be delivered across two days from 9am to 6pm, for a total of 16 hours. The contents of the course will be developed through frontal lessons as well as practical examples of tenders and implemented projects. The last lesson will be entirely focused on group works aiming at finding tenders related to the interests of the participants, and at developing potential project ideas. During the course, the trainers will be available for individual ad-hoc consultancy and coaching sessions.
