The Multiannual Financial Framework 2021-2027: what's that exactly and why it is so relevant?

The Multiannual Financial Framework (MFF) is not the same as the European budget.

The MFF is relevant because it defines the priorities of the European financial planning and lays out **how much the European Union intends to invest in each thematic area for the next seven-year period**. Thus, above all, the Multiannual Financial Framework is an expression of the political priorities set by the Union.

The first draft of the MFF for the period 2021-2027, was presented by the Commission to the Council in May 2018. Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, **last July 2020 EU leaders agreed on the long-term EU budget for 2021-2027, which will be worth 1074.3 billion euros**.

The budget will support **investment in the digital and green transitions**. They also agreed on the 750 billion euros recovery effort (**Next Generation EU**) to help the European Union tackling the crisis caused by the pandemic, of which 390 billion euros will be distributed in the form of grants to member states and 360 billion euros in loans.

The new MFF for the next seven years provides a good foundation for jointly addressing the imperatives for the future. It brings together growth, innovation and the pledge of social cohesion. It also takes into account the long-standing fields of cohesion and agricultural policy. The priorities laid out in the MFF include **research**, and stronger **European cooperation** in the field of **migration policy**. Security and defence policy too are covered. Climate change mitigation plays a major part in the programmes of the MFF and the recovery plan.

Objectives
