BACKGROUND

- <u>SHARED GREEN DEAL</u> is a Horizon-funded project involving 22 partners working to strengthen EU Green Deal policy initiatives through social sciences research. We're building a dynamic and engaged informal coalition of diverse stakeholders committed to securing ambitious, citizen-led green policy change across the EU.

The discussion format will allow for rotating conversations across key themes, ensuring a wide range of perspectives and ideas are taken into consideration.
