Ariane is a councillor in Antwerp focusing on climate, animal welfare and equal-opportunities portfolios, and member of the 2024-25 cohort of Young Elected Politicians (YEP) programme of the European Committee of the Regions. She is one of the youngest councillors of migrant background in Belgium.

Dorothea Letsai is 18 years old and has been part of the Ghent Youth Council for two years. She has strong experience in youth participation through both her high school student council and the Youth Council. She was closely involved in the Big Debate project, becoming one of the Big Debate ambassadors. As a youth representative, she posed questions to national politicians and EU Commissioner Schinas during the plenary debate attended by 800 youngsters.

Emilia Dams

Emilia is 22 years old and has been part of the Ghent Youth Council for more than two years. She was recently elected as co-president of the Youth Council. Emilia has strong leadership qualities and is deeply involved in youth participation and climate action. Climate being a central theme, during her studies in social work she focused on climate-related topics, and she will soon start working at the Green Office of Ghent University.



Sebastian Lindt

Sebastian is Policy Officer for Youth Participation and Democracy at the European Youth Forum, a network of over 100 youth organisations in Europe. His work is mostly focused on the EU Youth Dialogue, the largest European youth participation mechanism. He also works on safeguarding the European Solidarity Corps and Erasmus+ as programmes that deliver for all young people.
