Description			
<i>Provide a short description of the event and its activities.</i>			
The training was carried out over two days, on 3 and 4 June 2026. Day 1 Gender Mainstreaming Approach Training The first day opened with a training session on the Gender Mainstreaming Approach, introduced and facilitated by ALDA. The session began with an overview of the topics and sections that would be addressed throughout the training. ALDA provided participants with a comprehensive introduction to the concept of gender mainstreaming, including key definitions, gender stereotypes, unconscious biases, and the general theoretical framework underpinning the approach. The training was delivered with the support of two gender experts, including the Coordinator of ALDA's Hub on Gender, Inclusion and Human Rights. The theoretical part was followed by interactive activities designed to encourage participants' engagement and self-reflection. One of the exercises involved the use of the Identity Wheel, through which participants were invited to reflect on their own identities and consider the various dimensions that shape their experiences and perspectives. The training then moved to a more technical yet still interactive session focusing on gender inequalities in sport. Participants first took part in a Kahoot quiz aimed at assessing their knowledge of key statistics and trends related to gender disparities in sport, both from the athletes' and coaches' perspectives. Following the quiz, the facilitators reviewed the answers and presented relevant data and evidence illustrating the current challenges and inequalities affecting women in sport. The session continued with the presentation of several best practices and successful initiatives addressing gender equality in the sports sector. These examples provided inspiration and practical insights for participants. The first day concluded with group work activities. Participants were divided into smaller groups and worked together to identify the main challenges related to gender equality in sport and to develop policy recommendations. The outcomes of these discussions will contribute to the content of the Gender Mainstreaming Guidelines, which will be delivered as a separate project output. Day 2 Child Safeguarding framework Development The second day focused on the development of the Childhood Framework. The session began with an analysis of the safeguarding statements, policies, and procedures already in place within each participating organisation. Participants then worked in groups to develop an initial structure for Deliverable 2.3 – Child Safeguarding framework. This document will serve as a practical reference tool for partners during the implementation of future project activities, alongside the Gender Mainstreaming Guidelines presented during the previous day. The training concluded with a social lunch, providing participants with an opportunity to continue networking, exchange experiences, and strengthen collaboration among partner organisations.
